Dear Parishioners and Friends:

With this Newsletter comes finality in the sense that the old Liturgical Year is finished and a new one is on the threshold. I also write this letter with much happiness and yet full of anxiety. I am anxious due to the fact that I was hoping to say 'doesn't the front of the Cathedral look wonderful'. But I can't, at least not yet.

Due to a few set backs with the Landmarks Commission and the crazy way the weather has been, we are not yet able to finish the work on the sidewalks. However, they keep promising me that part of the scaffolding will be able to come down.

Work on the inside is progressing. A new Sacristy and Confessionals are being planned and constructed as I write this. The upper balconies have been reinforced with new flooring as well. One thing that we did not anticipate however is the fact that the chandeliers had to be taken down because of faulty wiring. They will be cleaned and rewired by the middle of December, just in time for the beautiful feast of Christmas. Honestly though it was an expense none of us saw coming.

All these things we must deal with in our every day lives here at the Cathedral. We are dealing with a very old historic building. Things have been neglected for many years and at times the work is overwhelming. None the less, as they say, we role up our sleeves and go to work.

I wish to thank the various committees and organizations who have worked so diligently and keeping us on track as best as possible. Without the Pastoral Council and the organizations it would not be possible to keep up with the demands of this Cathedral. Even though the majority of you are only here on Sunday, each and every day brings new experiences and at times problems.

But the Cathedral is much more than that. It must be the center of our spiritual life first and foremost. I wish people lived closer to the Cathedral to share in the rich Liturgical Life that we have here.

Each morning at 10:00 am a group of devoted parishioners from the area come and pray the Divine Liturgy. At the end of each daily Liturgy a specific Novena is prayed. Together, we have become a very close knit Spiritual Family. Without this small group of individuals I personally would not be able to continue to minister to this Cathedral Parish. They give me strength and reassurance in the work that must be accomplished here at Our Lady.

I have been reflecting for a few weeks now on the new Liturgical Year. When we say New Year's we think of resolutions and promises that we are not able to keep. The new Church Year however should not be looked at in the same way.

First of all, the first two weeks of the "New" Year are not really a Season as compared to 'Announcement' 'Lent' or 'Resurrection', etc. They do, however, begin the New Year by focusing on the Church. It is a time when, as the Gospels focus on the Jewish Temple and Jesus as the New Temple (John 2:19), we are asked to renew our lives and reconsecrate ourselves to Christ and his life of redemption.

I would like to challenge each and every parishioner at Our Lady of Lebanon. First of all we should not treat this "New Year" like any other New Year. It is not a time to make promises that we know we are not going to keep.

Secondly, we must take our Faith not at face value but rather seriously and in a profound way. So often I hear people say how religious they are. What they are saying is that they do the 'churchy' things like coming to Liturgy on Sunday or saying an occasional rosary or the like. But do we open the Sacred Scriptures daily and pray and reflect on them. Do we go to Confession on a regular basis. Do we fast and abstain each and every Friday of the year. Do we teach our children and families the same.

Thirdly, do we try to be a part of this Cathedral family or are we just on the edge.

So many individuals do so much for this Church from the bottoms of their hearts. Others only criticize and add nothing to the life of this community. We hear we should do this or that. We don't have enough for our youth and the such; but when asked to assist or do something about the situation, always decline to do so. In so many ways it is a very silent majority who try to understand what it means to be 'Church'. Now it is up to all of us to be a part of this Community of Faith. Now is the time to understand what Church really is, the "New Temple" who is Jesus Christ.

Marriage Preparation Class

All couples wishing to be married in the Cathedral must attend Marriage Pre-Cana classes. For those wishing to be married between October 2013 and November 2014 the first session will be offered on Saturday, February 22, 2014 beginning at 10:00 am and end around 3:00 pm. This course is mandatory with no exceptions. You may register by calling the Cathedral Office at 718.624.7228 or be contacting Msgr Root at aboonajim@verizon.net or Cathrectory@verizon.net.

Again, this is mandatory and all couples must participate in the Spiritual and Liturgical life of the Cathedral family.

Baptism and Chrismation Class

All parents and God-Parents of new born children will have to participate in a one hour class with Msgr. James in order to have their children Baptized and Chrismated at the Cathedral. Saturday, January 25, 2014 from 11:00 am to 12:00 noon. These classes are mandatory for the parents of the new born (one time) and for the God-parents. If you have attended a similar class at another Catholic Church you may bring in the Certificate as proof.

The reason for these classes is that most people do not understand the duties and responsibilities of God-Parents and the responsibility parents have in raising their children as *good Catholics*; not just Catholic.
