Dear Parishioners and Friends:

Saint John Climacus was born in Palestine in 525. His education and learning fitted him to live in an intellectual environment, but he chose, from an early age, to abandon the world for a life of solitude. The region of Mount Sinai was then celebrated for the holiness of the monks who inhabited it. Saint John trained himself to the practice of the Christian virtues under the direction of a monk named Martyrius.

After the death of Martyrius John, wishing to practice greater mortification, withdrew to a hermitage at the foot of the mountain. He lived in this isolation for some twenty years, constantly studying the lives of the saints and thus becoming one of the most learned doctors of the Church.

The monks of Sinai elected him abbot. He acquitted himself of his functions as abbot with the greatest wisdom. Four years later he resigned his charge and returned to his hermitage to prepare for death. Saint John Climacus has left us two important works; one of which is entitled Ladder of Paradise, it immediatley obtained an immense popularity, is addressed to anchorites and cenobites, and treats the means by which the highest degree of religious perfection may be attained. It is divided into thirty parts or steps in memory of the thirty years of the hidden life of Christ. Because of this work, the title "Climacus" (of the Ladder) was added to his name. Saint John died in the year 605. May his prayers be with us.
