Dear Beloved Parishioners

Through the parable of the rich man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31) which we heard proclaimed last Sunday, we find a key to understanding what we need to do in order to attain true happiness and eternal life during this Season of Lent.

1. The other person is a gift

The picture is one of great misery; it portrays a man disgraced and pitiful. The scene is even more dramatic if we consider that the poor man is called *Lazarus*, a name full of promise, which literally means God helps. While practically invisible to the rich man, the poor man is not anonymous to Luke's community and the reader of today. He becomes a face and a gift whom God loves and cares for. This parable teaches us that other persons are a gift. A right relationship with people consists in gratefully recognizing the value of each human being. Lent is a favorable season for opening the doors to all those in need and recognizing in them the face of Christ.

2. Sin blinds us

The rich man feasted sumptuously every day and dressed in expensive robes. The man was clearly ostentatious about his wealth, and was in the habit of displaying it daily. The purple cloth was even more precious than silver and gold, and was thus reserved to divinities and kings while fine linen gave one an almost sacred character. In him, we can catch a dramatic glimpse of the corruption of sin, which progresses in three successive stages: love of money, vanity and pride. Instead of being an instrument at our service for doing good and showing solidarity towards others, money may chain us and the entire world to a selfish logic that leaves no room for love and hinders peace.

3. The Word is a gift

The liturgy of starting Lent with ashes invites us to an experience quite similar to that of the rich man. When the priest imposes the ashes on our heads, he repeats the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." The greater part of the parable takes place in the afterlife where the two characters suddenly discover that they brought nothing into the world, and took nothing out of it. The rich man recognizes Lazarus only amid the torments of the afterlife and wants the poor man to alleviate his suffering with a drop of water. What he asks of Lazarus is similar to what he could have done on earth but never did. Then, the rich man asks Abraham to send Lazarus to warn his brothers, who are still alive. But Abraham answers: "They have Moses and the prophets, let them listen to them." Countering the rich man's objections, he adds: "If they will not listen either to Moses or to the prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead." The rich man's real problem thus comes to the fore, which was the failure to heed God's word. When we close our heart to the gift of God's word, we end up closing our heart to the gift of our

Traditional Fasting & Abstinence Observance

Those who wish to observe the traditional Maronite practice of fasting and abstinence are invited to follow this practice. According to the Synod of Mount Lebanon of 1736, every weekday of Lent (Monday through Friday) is a day of fasting and abstinence from meat and dairy products (eggs, butter, milk etc.) Fasting involves eating and drinking nothing at all (except water and medicine) from midnight until noon. The rest of the day normal meals can be taken but without meat or dairy products. Saturdays and Sundays are exempt from fasting and abstaining as are the following feast days: St Maron on Feb, 9th if it falls during Lent, the 40 Martyrs on March 9th, and St. Joseph on March 19th.

First Sunday of Great Lent: Cana Sunday

The Letter to the Romans 14:14-23.

I know and am persuaded in the Lord Jesus that nothing is unclean in itself; but it is unclean for anyone who thinks it unclean. If your brother or sister is being injured by what you eat, you are no longer walking in love. Do not let what you eat cause the ruin of one for whom Christ died. So do not let your good be spoken of as evil. For the kingdom of God is not food and drink but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit. The one who thus serves Christ is acceptable to God and has human approval. Let us then pursue what makes for peace and for mutual edification.

Do not, for the sake of food, destroy the work of God. Everything is indeed clean, but it is wrong for you to make others fall by what you eat; it is good not to eat meat or drink wine or do anything that makes your brother or sister stumble. The faith that you have, have as your own conviction before God. Blessed are those who have no reason to condemn themselves because of what they approve. But those who have doubts are condemned if they eat, because they do not act from faith; for whatever does not proceed from faith is sin.

The Gospel according to Saint John 2: 1-11.

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, 'Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward.' So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now.' Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.
