Dear Beloved Parishioners

The Sunday of the Healing of the Blind Man is the last Sunday before entering into Passion Week. *The Maronite Prayer of the Faithful* gives us a nice summary on this Sunday.

“A theme that is central to the Maronite Liturgy is Jesus as the Light of the world and daily we invoke Mary as the Mother of the Light. On this Sixth Sunday of Lent, we recall Bartimaeus, the blind man who wanted to behold the Light of the world. Jesus was on the way to celebrate his last Passover. He was traveling along the road to Jericho, a resort city, also known as the City of the Palms.”

“Jericho was fifteen miles from Jerusalem and Passover was a very spiritually tense time. Jesus was considered a rebel, and was thought of as one who was preaching against orthodox Judaism. Jericho was filled with priests and Levites, who took turns in serving at the Temple. Naturally, they would be concerned about what Jesus had to say.

“Jesus and the crowds were approaching the gate of the city where Bartimaeus, a blind beggar, was sitting. It was a good time to beg for alms because of the number of persons who walked by. When he heard the tramping of feet and the noise of the crowd and heard it was Jesus, he began to shout in order to attract Jesus’ attention. The crowd that was trying to listen to the Master was offended and tired to silence the beggar who wanted to escape from his world of darkness. When Jesus indicated that he wanted to see Bartimaeus, the attitude of the people changed and they encouraged the blind man to get up and come to Jesus. He immediately threw off his cloak and rushed to the Lord.

“In many ways, we are called to be like the beggar. Certain opportunities come only once and when the Lord calls us, we must throw off anything that will hinder us and run to Christ.

“The blind man knew what he wanted; he wanted light and he received the gift of inner light, the gift of faith, in addition to his sight.

“Let us not allow the world to prevent us from seeking the Light and let us cast aside all that hinders us and go to meet the Lord.”

During our short time on this earth, we prepare ourselves for the day when we shall stand before God to make an account of how we have spent our lives. In the meantime, we serve with love. The Church, founded by Christ, is the prime vehicle of this love, and of our service, and this is the sole purpose of the Eparchy of Saint Maron of Brooklyn.



Sixth Sunday of Great Lent: Healing the Blind Man

Second Letter to the Corinthians 10: 1-7

I myself, Paul, appeal to you by the meekness and gentleness of Christ I who am humble when face to face with you, but bold towards you when I am away!

I ask that when I am present I need not show boldness by daring to oppose those who think we are acting according to human standards.

Indeed, we live as human beings, but we do not wage war according to human standards;

for the weapons of our warfare are not merely human, but they have divine power to destroy strongholds. We destroy arguments

and every proud obstacle raised up against the knowledge of God, and we take every thought captive to obey Christ.

We are ready to punish every disobedience when your obedience is complete.

Look at what is before your eyes. If you are confident that you belong to Christ, remind yourself of this, that just as you belong to Christ, so also do we.

The Gospel according to Saint Mark 10: 46-52

They came to Jericho. As Jesus and his disciples and a large crowd were leaving Jericho, Bartimaeus son of Timaeus, a blind beggar, was sitting by the roadside.

When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout out and say, 'Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!'

Many sternly ordered him to be quiet, but he cried out even more loudly, 'Son of David, have mercy on me!'

Jesus stood still and said, 'Call him here.' And they called the blind man, saying to him, 'Take heart; get up, he is calling you.'

So throwing off his cloak, he sprang up and came to Jesus.

Then Jesus said to him, 'What do you want me to do for you?' The blind man said to him, 'My teacher, let me see again.'

Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has made you well.'

Immediately he regained his sight and followed him on the way.
