

Dear Beloved Parishioners:

The following are Bishop Gregory's remarks at the 75th Anniversary gala last Sunday.

"What are we celebrating today?

Are we celebrating that in 1890 the Maronite Patriarch assigned Father Peter Korkemaz as the first Maronite Priest serving the first Maronite parish in lower Manhattan named St. Joseph? That was 129 years ago; No, we are celebrating something different. Or in 1906 when the first Maronites established themselves on Hicks Street as Our Lady of Lebanon and Father Khairallah Estefan, was their first pastor? That was 113 years ago; No, we are celebrating something different. Or in 1844 when the Congregational Church of the Pilgrims built their first home in Brooklyn on the corner of Henry and Remsen Streets? That was 175 years ago; No, we are celebrating something different.

"We are celebrating today that on November 26, 1944 the first Divine Liturgy was celebrated at the former Church of the Pilgrims, which became Our Lady of Lebanon at the corner of Henry and Remsen. That was 75 years ago. This is why we celebrate today. We celebrate today the first time we "broke bread" according to our ancient Aramaic Maronite Tradition, a tradition that goes all the way back to the first Aramaic speaking followers of Christ, called Christians for the very first time in Antioch.

"We celebrate 'the breaking of bread', something special and unique that we have done in homes, in catacombs, in mountain caves, hidden from persecutors and in Churches. The Church building is a temporary home made for the people who live in that home. The people who live in that home is the Church. The table of that home is the Altar, and the Meal of that home is the Eucharist. And so today we celebrate that for 75 years, every Sunday, we have gathered to commemorate the 'Day of the Lord', the day on which Jesus rose from the dead, and we remember him by doing what he asked us to do; as our Liturgy says, 'Every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you remember my death and resurrection until I come again.' These words of our Divine Liturgy remind us just how special is our Sunday ritual: We offer and partake of His body, His blood, real, not symbols, not signs, and we have the joy and privilege to 'Break the bread and drink the cup in memory of Him, until He comes again.'

"Brothers and sisters, it is not the Church building that we celebrate today, as beautiful as it is, it is not the history of the Maronites in the New York area, as noble as this is, it is not any external, temporary or passing reality that we celebrate today; today we celebrate the fact that for 75 years we continue to break the bread and drink the cup as Jesus asked us. This is the reason we celebrate today.

"May Christ, broken on the Cross, delivered for us as a sacrificial lamb for the forgiveness of our sins, and risen from the dead for our salvation, continue to be first in our hearts. And may we always and every Sunday, until he comes again, come to know, and more to deeply love him, 'in the breaking of bread.'



Sunday of the Visitation to Elizabeth

Letter to the Ephesians 1,1-14.

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, To the saints who are in Ephesus and are faithful in Christ Jesus: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. He destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance towards redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

The Gospel according to Saint Luke 1:39-45.

In those days Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth.

When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit

and exclaimed with a loud cry, 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb.

And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me?

For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leapt for joy.

And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her by the Lord.'

إنجيل القديس لوقا 1:39-45
