Dear Beloved Parishioners:

Let me start my reflection today by wishing a blessed, joyful and holy Christmas to all of you, your families, and all your loved ones. We might have been approaching Christmas burdened by conflicts, confusions, doubts, misunderstandings, economic uncertainties, health problems or worries about the future. We might have also been missing friends, family or loved ones or are being missed by those living abroad. All of these feelings are being combined with some joy and a little satisfaction with where we are and what we have accomplished so far. I am saying all this to assure you that what we are going through is not far from what so many biblical figures we have encountered throughout this Season of the Glorious Birth have also experienced.

Let us look back to see how our experience pretty much matches that of those persons we already met while we were moving from one Sunday to another during this Season of the Glorious Birth.

- Zechariah doubted the Archangel Gabriel, but Elizabeth conceived anyway. Here is what she said, "This is what the Lord has done for me when he looked favorably on me and took away the disgrace I have endured among my people."
- Elizabeth went into seclusion and hid herself from people for five months, but at the end her neighbors and relatives knew and rejoiced at the birth of John.
- Mary was afraid and asked a couple of questions, but she conceived the Son of God. In her hymn of praise, she proclaimed, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant."
- Joseph felt deceived, but the angel in a dream assured him that the one to be born of Mary was from the Holy Spirit and was the Son of God.
- The shepherds, in the Gospel read on Christmas, were first terrified when the glory of the Lord shone around them, but they went anyway to see what they were told about by the angel. They found Mary and Joseph and saw the infant lying in the manger. After they visited them, the shepherds went back to their flock. Luke put it beautifully, "The shepherds returned glorifying and praising God for all they have heard and seen." Those who were terrified were now chanting, praising God like the host of angels who had appeared before the shepherds left for Bethlehem. And the shepherds had become like the angels.

Whether we reject, doubt, or refuse God's plan in our lives, his plan is going to be fulfilled, if not in us, in other people and through other means. God had spoken through various signs in the past and people did not believe him, but in due time he spoke through his only Son because he does not hold grudges and keep a tally.

In today's world, most people have problems accepting others who have pre-exiting conditions they do not like. However, God operates differently; he accepts us with pre-existing conditions and with post-existing conditions. He knows our weaknesses, but he accepts us anyway. He knows our comings and goings and he is there on every corner in our life waiting for us to call on him.

As we are approaching the blessed holy night of Christmas, may our fears be transformed to praises, our confusions to certainties, our conflicts to peace, our divisions to unity. Christ is born! Alleluia.



Genealogy Sunday Letter to the Romans 1:1-12

Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy scriptures, the gospel concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh and was declared to be Son of God with power according to the spirit of holiness by resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith among all the Gentiles for the sake of his name, including yourselves who are called to belong to Jesus Christ, To all God's beloved in Rome, who are called to be saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.
