Dear Beloved Parishioners:

It is not God who led the world to this point of panic and terror over the coronavirus. Fear is the work of the evil one and his legions and not the work of God Almighty. In the First Letter of John, it is written, "There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love" (1 John 4: 18).

What is going on in the world today is the product of our wrongdoing. We think of ourselves as the masters of the universe. No one can challenge the decisions we make. We think: I know everything and you know nothing, and I am better than you. We believe no authority in the family, in society or in the Church exists anymore. When a father in his house, a teacher in the classroom or a priest in his church cannot gently recommend or even suggest something or advise children, students, or parishioners for fear of offending them or of being politically incorrect, we are inevitably heading toward something bad.

When we act like a god and fail to respect divine and natural law by manipulating genes and changing chromosomes in laboratories to clone human beings, when we decide to kill a baby in the womb because "I do not feel I want to be a parent today and I am not ready to raise a child," when nations or even people seek their own interests and climb the ladder of success by stepping on others or using and abusing the world's common resources, no wonder the world around us is melting down.

My friends, we have gone over and beyond the margin of error that we were given. We are like the prodigal son of last week's gospel passage who asked his father for his inheritance because he wanted to leave home. The father did not kick him out. On the contrary, he gave him the money reluctantly and in pain saw his child going away. Creation and life are gifts from God and we decided to depart from his realm and set up new rules for the game. We now face a virus outbreak that is hard to contain worldwide.

My prayer is that this virus will help us to come back to our senses like the younger son and confess, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me like one of your hired hands." This is the beginning

of the journey back.

Good news: Catholic Extension Society recently announced that it will make a \$25,000 grant to our Eparchy in 2020 for our Seminarian Endowments – if certain conditions are met!

As we enter into the season of preparation through prayer, fasting and almsgiving, I ask you to recall all the ways in which God has blessed you. As you reflect on that, I also ask you to consider supporting the Eparchy of Saint Maron with a donation to our 2020 Lenten Appeal, to further the Eparchy's mission of service to God's faithful people.

- Seminarians: We currently have five men preparing for the priesthood. Our seminarians are our future priests, and we want them to get the best education and formation possible. Fifth Sunday Lent: Sunday of the Man who was Paralyzed

First Letter to Timothy 5:24-6: 5

The sins of some people are conspicuous and precede them to judgement, while the sins of others follow them there. So also good works are conspicuous; and even when they are not, they cannot remain hidden. Let all who are under the yoke of slavery regard their masters as worthy of all honor, so that the name of God and the teaching may not be blasphemed. Those who have believing masters must not be disrespectful to them on the ground that they are members of the church; rather they must serve them all the more, since those who benefit by their service are believers and beloved. Teach and urge these duties. Whoever teaches otherwise and does not agree with the sound words of our Lord Jesus Christ and the teaching that is in accordance with godliness, is conceited, understanding nothing, and has a morbid craving for controversy and for disputes about words. From these come envy, dissension, slander, base suspicions, and wrangling among those who are depraved in mind and bereft of the truth, imagining that godliness is a means of gain.

The Gospel according to Saint Mark 2:1-12

When Jesus returned to Capernaum after some days, it was reported that he was at home. So many gathered around that there was no longer room for them, not even in front of the door; and he was speaking the word to them. Then some people came, bringing to him a paralyzed man, carried by four of them. And when they could not bring him to Jesus because of the crowd, they removed the roof above him; and after having dug through it, they let down the mat on which the paralytic lay. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, 'Son, your sins are forgiven.' Now some of the scribes were sitting there, questioning in their hearts, 'Why does this fellow speak in this way? It is blasphemy! Who can forgive sins but God alone?' At once Jesus perceived in his spirit that they were discussing these questions among themselves; and he said to them, 'Why do you raise such questions in your hearts?

Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, "Your sins are forgiven", or to say, "Stand up and take your mat and walk"? But so that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins' he said to the paralytic 'I say to you, stand up, take your mat and go to your home.' And he stood up, and immediately took the mat and went out before all of them; so that they were all amazed and glorified God, saying, 'We have never seen anything like this!'
