

Dear Beloved Parishioners:

A week and a half ago schools and colleges were closed and last Friday all non-essential businesses in New York were asked to stop operation. People were advised to stay home and not go out unless it was necessary for them to do so. The streets and sidewalks that used to buzz with people rushing here and there are empty. The entire City of New York is slowing down and the lifestyle of its people is changing drastically as they try to combat the coronavirus. Terms like quarantine, self-isolation, shelter-in-place, state of emergency and lockdown are now common words and becoming part of our daily vocabulary. All these measures are extremely disturbing to interactions with others and they jeopardize the social networking upon which communities, neighborhoods and countries are founded.

However, what is most troubling to me personally is the interruption of worship, especially on Sundays. At first, it started with refraining from giving the sign of peace in an attempt to minimize the spread of the virus. And then, from Monday of the current week until further notice, the Divine Liturgy and devotions at churches can now no longer be attended by the faithful, so no Communion is being distributed.

The greeting of peace at the beginning of the Anaphora goes from the Altar to the priest and then to the people. It represents the peace of God that we receive in our hearts and we are making it into a visible sign and passing it on to others. When the congregation two weeks ago was asked to stop giving the sign of peace, it made me think that we have probably been exchanging a visible sign that does not really testify to what should be in our hearts, the real peace of Christ. Today might be an opportunity to mediate on whether we are at peace with one another and with God before going back to visibly sharing the sign again with joined hands.

In addition, this disruption of the liturgical life of the Church resembles what has been happening in the Middles East for years and most recently during the rise of ISIS. Instead of most of the churches being closed, churches in Syria and Iraq were destroyed. The Church in the West supported and stood by them as much as it could, but now our solidarity with them is taking a different form because we are getting to know what it means to be deprived of the Eucharist and the upcoming Easter season celebrations.

My Friends, God does not want us to only get through this crisis, he wants to use us during this crisis. Let us deeply reflect on our relationship with one another and benefit from this time of isolation and make the necessary changes in our attitude before going back to true worship.

Order of Saint Sharbel Matching Grant

Good news: Catholic Extension Society recently announced that it will make a \$25,000 grant to our Eparchy in 2020 for our Seminarian Endowments – if certain conditions are met!

Each Eparchy can earn the \$25,000 grant if they enroll at least 15 new Perpetual Members in the Order of Saint Sharbel by December 31. Membership dues and donations must be <u>received</u> by December 31, 2020 to qualify.

This is not the first time that the Eparchies have received matching grants from Catholic Extension. Similar grants were made in 2012, 2013, 2015 and 2016 after the Order of Saint Sharbel met similar challenges. The Eparchies were selected after a competitive application process each time.

Order of Saint Sharbel President Jim Abdo of Minneapolis immediately put out a call to Members of the Order to invite their friends, family members and fellow parishioners to join or to recruit new Members or to make a gift of Membership, saying, "We do not want to waste this great opportunity!"

Perpetual Membership in the Order requires a donation of \$5,000. The payment can be made in one lump sum, or in four quarterly installments over the course of a year. Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we enter into the season of preparation through prayer, fasting and almsgiving, I ask you to recall all the ways in which God has blessed you. As you reflect on that, I also ask you to consider supporting the Eparchy of Saint Maron with a donation to our 2020 Lenten Appeal, to further the Eparchy's mission of service to God's faithful people.

Your generosity towards this year's Annual Eparchial Appeal will support:

- Seminarians: We currently have five men preparing for the priesthood. Our seminarians are our future priests, and we want them to get the best education and formation possible. Each seminarian costs about \$45,000 per year, in the form of tuition, books, room, board, health insurance and other costs. 40% of your contribution to this year's Annual Appeal will go for Seminarians.

Second Letter to the Corinthians 10: 1-7

I myself, Paul, appeal to you by the meekness and gentleness of Christ I who am humble when face to face with you, but bold towards you when I am away!

I ask that when I am present I need not show boldness by daring to oppose those who think we are acting according to human standards.

Indeed, we live as human beings, but we do not wage war according to human standards;

for the weapons of our warfare are not merely human, but they have divine power to destroy strongholds. We destroy arguments

and every proud obstacle raised up against the knowledge of God, and we take every thought captive to obey Christ.

We are ready to punish every disobedience when your obedience is complete.

Look at what is before your eyes. If you are confident that you belong to Christ, remind yourself of this, that just as you belong to Christ, so also do we.
