Dear Beloved Parishioners:

Last Sunday was a Forty Day Memorial Divine Liturgy for a parishioner. The column this week is from my homily then.

As Christians we are told we should not be crying or grieving at the loss of someone we love. Christ was raised from the dead and trampled death. There is no need to grieve. We are actually told to be happy that the person is joining God.

There are two extremes here. Either we grieve to the point of despair, as if Christ were not raised from the dead, or we rejoice for the person who is joining Jesus Christ, as if life on earth were meaningless and did not matter. These two extremes are to be avoided. We are to grieve the passing of a loved one with Christ's hope in us that the deceased will inherit eternal life.

A lot of times we ask ourselves what is the point of life if we are going to die and join Christ at a given time. The answer is in the passage from the Gospel we just read (Matthew 10:16-25). When Jesus said, "I am sending you like sheep into the midst of wolves," we immediately think of the worst-case scenarios of how the wolves will destroy us. No? In fact, the passage helps us to think this way: "They will hand you over to councils and flog you in their synagogues and you will be dragged before governors and kings. Brother will betray brother to death, and a father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put to death; and you will be hated."

Sometimes we fall and go in the wrong direction. We get so terrified and afraid of the wolves. This is illustrated in a story an art critic recounted about Leonardo da Vinci when he was planning to paint The Lord's Supper while living in Milan. "Before he could paint the thirteen figures, it was necessary to find men who could serve as models. Each model had to have a face that expressed da Vinci's vision of the particular man he would represent. Needless to say, it proved to be a tedious task to find just the right face. One Sunday, as da Vinci was at the cathedral, he saw a young man in the back praying who looked like da Vinci's idea of how Jesus must have looked. He had the features of love, tenderness, caring, innocence, compassion, and kindness. Arrangements were made for the young man to sit as the model for the Lord. Years went by, and the painting was still not complete. Da Vinci could not find just the right face for Judas. He was looking for a man whose face was streaked with despair, wickedness, greed and sin. He found a man in prison

whose face wore all the qualities of Judas for which he had been searching. Consent was given for the prisoner to pose, and he sat as the model for Judas. Leonardo worked feverishly for days. But as the work went on, he noticed certain changes taking place in the prisoner. His face seemed filled with tension, and his bloodshot eyes were filled with horror as he gaped at the likeness of himself being painted. One day, Leonardo sensed the man's uneasiness so greatly that he stopped painting and asked, 'What seems to trouble you so much?' The man buried his face in his hands and was convulsed with sobs. After a long time, he raised his head and inquired, 'Don't you remember me? Years ago I was your model for the Lord Jesus.' This miserable man had turned his back on Christ and turned his life over to sin and the world had sucked him down to its lowest levels of degradation. Things that he at one time hated and despised, now he loved."

Unfortunately, life can change us so much that we become wolves and we lose our sheep status. My friends, our mission is actually to change the wolves into sheep. And Christ is not setting us up for failure. He is equipping us with wisdom and humility to change the wolves into sheep. Please, please let us use these gifts.

So what is the point of living? It is, if we have become, God forbid, wolves, to discover anew what we are meant to be, wise and humble sheep.

Order of Saint Sharbel Matching Grant

Good news: Catholic Extension Society recently announced that it will make a \$25,000 grant to our Eparchy in 2020 for our Seminarian Endowments – if certain conditions are met!

Each Eparchy can earn the \$25,000 grant if they enroll at least 15 new Perpetual Members in the Order of Saint Sharbel by December 31. Membership dues and donations must be <u>received</u> by December 31, 2020 to qualify.

This is not the first time that the Eparchies have received matching grants from Catholic Extension. Similar grants were made in 2012, 2013, 2015 and 2016 after the Order of Saint Sharbel met similar challenges. The Eparchies were selected after a competitive application process each time.

Order of Saint Sharbel President Jim Abdo of Minneapolis immediately put out a call to Members of the Order to invite their friends, family members and fellow parishioners to join or to recruit new Members or to make a gift of Membership, saying, "We do not want to waste this great opportunity!"

Perpetual Membership in the Order requires a donation of \$5,000. The payment can be made in one lump sum, or in four quarterly installments over the course of a year. Second Letter to the Corinthians 3:1-6

Are we beginning to commend ourselves again? Surely we do not need, as some do, letters of recommendation to you or from you, do we? You yourselves are our letter, written on our hearts, to be known and read by all; and you show that you are a letter of Christ, prepared by us, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts. Such is the confidence that we have through Christ towards God. Not that we are competent of ourselves to claim anything as coming from us; our competence is from God, who has made us competent to be ministers of a new covenant, not of letter but of spirit; for the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life.

The Gospel of St. Luke 10: 1-7

After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. He said to them, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, "Peace to this house!" And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the laborer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house.
