

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

Jeffery Feldman, a former ambassador of the United States of America to Lebanon, in an article entitled *Lebanon as Paradise Lost* wrote after the explosion of August 4th, 2020, "A self-referential joke once common in Lebanon posited that God bestowed Lebanon with beautiful mountains, stunning beaches, freshwater resources, fertile soil and fruited plains, and creative, attractive people: paradise. But then God realized that heaven is reserved for the afterlife—so he created...." If I continue with the quote, I enter the realm of politics which I do not want to do. In his description, the former ambassador compared Lebanon to a piece of heaven on earth. He only knew it between 2004 and 2008. Can you imagine how he might have described it if he had known it before the civil war of 1975?

In the late 80s in the midst of the Civil War, Majida El Roumi, a well-known classical Lebanese singer, sang for Beirut a piece written by the famous poet Nizar Qobbani, "We profess before the one God, that we were jealous of you [Beirut] and your beauty was hurting us... and we have gifted you a knife instead of a rose." Beirut, for Majida and Niza, is a beautiful lady with human qualities and characteristics, fully alive, but scarred. Mr. Feldman knew Beirut fourteen or fifteen years after the Lebanese war and he still saw in her a part of God's created paradise, Lebanon.

I was watching President Emmanuel Macron in his press conference in Beirut the day after the blast and I asked myself why the President of France would go to Lebanon less than twelve hours after the huge explosion. Why would the President of an organized, civilized and modern nation like France travel right away to a dysfunctional country like Lebanon? Why would the President of a European country cancel his planned meetings and postpone his dealings with the Covid crisis and economic issues to spend a full day in devastated Beirut? Did the French president go to Beirut because it has a special charm to it that compelled him to go? I think so. But where does this charm and attraction come from?

Psalm 29: 5 reads, "The voice of the Lord breaks the cedars; the Lord breaks the cedars of Lebanon." Beirut is the capital of Lebanon, and Lebanon is the country of the cedars. Like the olive tree, the cedar is a sacred tree, God's tree. Some cedar trees are three thousand years old. Others were used to build the temple of Solomon, the house of God. The cedar of Lebanon endures extreme cold weather with strong winds and an immense amount of snow, to say the least. I think the charm of Lebanon and its capital Beirut comes from the fragrance and perseverance of God's sacred cedar tree. Beirut cannot break easily and the paradise it is not lost even when the city is covered with ashes and rubble.

We might think that Beirut is destroyed, but, believe me, it is not. It will take much more than 2,750 tons of Ammonium Nitrate to annihilate Beirut. It is only the voice of the Lord if he wills it that can break the city. But will God abolish his paradise, his piece of heaven on earth?

The cedars of Lebanon are Beirut's protectors and anyone who conspires to destroy Beirut has to destroy those enduring cedars too. Keep in mind that the cedars are God's trees. The cedars belong to God.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we enter into the season of preparation through prayer, fasting and almsgiving, I ask you to recall all the ways in which God has blessed you. As you reflect on that, I also ask you to consider supporting the Eparchy of Saint Maron with a donation to our 2020 Lenten Appeal, to further the Eparchy's mission of service to God's faithful people.

Your generosity towards this year's Annual Eparchial Appeal will support:

- Seminarians: We currently have five men preparing for the priesthood. Our seminarians are our future priests, and we want them to get the best education and formation possible. We need your help to invest in their education and formation. Each seminarian costs about \$45,000 per year, in the form of tuition, books, room, board, health insurance and other costs. 40% of your contribution to this year's Annual Appeal will go for Seminarians.
- Ministries: Our ministries to young people, the elderly, families, and in defense of life from conception to natural death, help people at the most critical times in their lives. Please help ensure that the Eparchy can help those in need when they need help the most. 20% of your contribution will go to support Ministries.
- Retired Priests: Collectively, the 15 retired priests of the Eparchy served the faithful for over 500 years. Now, we help them with a modest pension of \$2,000 per month. 20% of your contribution will go to support Retired Priests.
- Helping in Lebanon and the Middle East: The Eparchy assists Lebanon and the Middle East in multiple ways, for example: by applying for grants to American foundations and donors, advocating for the persecuted Christians of the Middle East with the U.S. government, and channeling and providing direct financial assistance. 10% of your contribution will go to support Christians in Lebanon and the Middle East.
- Endowment: The Eparchy's Endowment Fund provides a source of income each year for the needs of the Eparchy and ensures that the Eparchy will have resources in the future. It also provides a "rainy day fund" if needed in the future. 10% of your contribution will be deposited into the Eparchy's Endowment.

I pray that you will open your heart once again and consider giving a gift. Your participation in this Annual Appeal makes a positive difference in the lives of so many people, both inside the Eparchy, and outside of it in the Middle East. Any gift you make will help.


