Dear Parishioners & Friends:

Last week, the Gospel on Sunday concluded with a shocking verse from Mark. It read, "So they [the women] went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid" (Mark 16:8). It seemed that Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome failed to bring the good news of the resurrection to the disciples. There was doubt and confusion among the Apostles. Was he alive? Was he raised? These kinds of questions were asked by the disciples.

This Sunday the Gospel talks about the Apostle Thomas coming to believe in the resurrection of Jesus. At a previous appearance of the Lord—not read this Sunday— Thomas was not present with the other disciples, so he doubted, saying, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe" (John 20:25).

The disciples were still in shock at the crucifixion of their master that Friday and could not understand how the Romans with the Jewish authorities would go so far as to crucify Jesus. The crimes that they accused Jesus of were false and if they had been true, the punishment should not have been crucifixion. To them, it was out of the question for their master to die on the cross. It looked like the Twelve did not want to believe that their rabbi was dead and did not want to admit the shameful way he was executed by being hung on the cross.

Now on Sunday Morning, the disciples could not bear another shocking reality: that their master was raised and was alive. In fact, the disciples had not recovered from the terrible experience of the crucifixion and were not ready for yet another astonishing truth. Psychologically speaking, for an unexpected death or unjust murder, in the stages of mourning of the family and close friends of the victim, there is usually a phase of denial. So Thomas might have thought that the disciples did not want to admit that their master was now dead. Thomas seemed to be ahead of the disciples in moving on with his life by admitting that Jesus was dead. Please remember in the first appearance, Thomas was not with the other disciples in the upper room which probably meant he had put thoughts of Jesus behind him. That was it for him: Jesus was dead and the disciples' fellowship would be ending soon.

But here is the Lord appearing again to his disciples and especially to Thomas. After Jesus' greeting, he asked Thomas to look and see his wounds and to put his finger in the nail marks of his hands and feet, and in his side. At that moment, Thomas believed because he saw the resurrected Lord who would be bearing forever the marks and signs of his crucifixion. The mystery of the death and resurrection of our Lord is not two separate events but one. There is a connection between the death and the resurrection, between its suffering and its glory. And in Jesus' body, this mystery is revealed. Thomas doubted Jesus' resurrection, not his death, but Jesus showed him the marks of his death as proof. It was not Jesus' appearance or the empty tomb or anything other than the marks on Jesus' body that made Thomas believe.

My friends, thus, bearing the marks of the crucifixion for eternity is a pledge that our Lord will always bear our sins.

Christ is risen, he is truly risen!

Second Letter to the Corinthians 5,11-21. Therefore, knowing the fear of the Lord, we try to persuade others; but we ourselves are well known to God, and I hope that we are also well known to your consciences.

We are not commending ourselves to you again, but giving you an opportunity to boast about us, so that you may be able to answer those who boast in outward appearance and not in the heart. For if we are beside ourselves, it is for God; if we are in our right mind, it is for you. For the love of Christ urges us on, because we are convinced that one has died for all; therefore, all have died. And he died for all, so that those who live might live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised for them. From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.
