Last week's Gospel, Matthew 10: 1-7, made me think more and more about authority and governance in the Church at the local and at the universal level. The passage begins with Jesus summoning the Twelve and giving them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out and also to cure every disease and every sickness. The Evangelist, then, goes on to name the disciples. Two of them were given attributes: Matthew who was called the tax collector and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him. The disciples were then sent out with the following instructions from Jesus, "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, proclaim the good news, 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.'"

It is clear that Jesus is passing on to his disciples powers he himself has or has received from his Father. Now the disciples, still weak and inexperienced at the beginning of Jesus' public life, are entrusted with a lot of authority. Nonetheless, Jesus limits, at first, the scope of their activities, so the disciples, at this point in the game, were not given free range to use their powers everywhere. They were only allowed to go to their own people, to the lost sheep of the house of Israel, and not to the Samaritans or to the Gentiles. Later on, once they were proven worthy in exercising their authority after Jesus' resurrection, they were sent to make disciples of all nations, "baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19).

This initial summoning of the Twelve highlights the steps later adopted by the Church to assign people to various ministries. It starts by identifying the powers, then naming those who receive them, and finally sending them on a specific mission to serve others through the use of these powers. Among the disciples who were named only two were given additional description: Matthew the tax collector that reflected on his life before becoming a disciple and Judas Iscariot, the one who handed Jesus over to be put on trial. With power comes trust and the ability to do great things. Matthew went to preach the Good News of Christ in Alexandria and received the crown of martyrdom, but Judas Iscariot on the other hand brought martyrdom to Jesus by betraying his power and trust.

Today, the Church usually does a good job in describing particular offices and ministries that carry specific powers and also tries to assign the right people to occupy the position in question. However, as in the secular world, so also in the Church, power sometimes tempts those who are assigned a particular ministry. Instead of fulfilling their service, they want to exercise more authority than the Church determined. The model of Matthew the tax collector faithfully serving must be kept before our eyes and is to be sought, or many of us will end up hurting the Church in a way similar to what Judas

Iscariot did to Jesus.

Letter to the Hebrews 12: 1-9

Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.

Consider him who endured such hostility against himself from sinners, so that you may not grow weary or lose heart. In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood. And you have forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as children 'My child, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, or lose heart when you are punished by him; for the Lord disciplines those whom he loves, and chastises every child whom he accepts.' Endure trials for the sake of discipline. God is treating you as children; for what child is there whom a parent does not discipline? If you do not have that discipline in which all children share, then you are illegitimate and not his children. Moreover, we had human parents to discipline us, and we respected them. Should we not be even more willing to be subject to the Father of spirits and live?

The Gospel according to Saint Luke 12: 6-10

Are not five sparrows sold for two pennies? Yet not one of them is forgotten in God's sight. But even the hairs of your head are all counted. Do not be afraid; you are of more value than many sparrows. 'And I tell you, everyone who acknowledges me before others, the Son of Man also will acknowledge before the angels of God;

but whoever denies me before others will be denied before the angels of God.

And everyone who speaks a word against the Son of Man will be forgiven; but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven.
