

Dear Parishioners & Friends,

On the last day of 2022, the world lost not only a former head of the Catholic Church, a Pope Emeritus, who governed the Church from 2005 to 2013, but also a great thinker and teacher.

When Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger was elected pope in 2005, he had been the Prefect of the Dicastery of the Doctrine of the Faith since the 80s. This department of the Roman Curia works on safeguarding the integrity of Catholic teaching on faith and morals and protecting the Church from errors. For being vigilant and ensuring that errors and dangerous teachings circulating among the Christian people not go without being responded to adequately, Cardinal Ratzinger, originally from Germany, was called by the media the German Shepherd.

It is not easy to be pope to begin with, but to be elected successor of the great charismatic John Paul II who was the Roman Pontiff for 26 years was even more difficult. Cardinal Ratzinger had big shoes to fill. Talking about shoes, he was criticized for being a fashionista for his red loafers by people who did not know traditional papal attire. Anything Pope Benedict did carried teaching weight to it. In wearing the red shoes, he wanted to remind people that the pope walks in the blood of the martyrs upon whom the Church was built. They now symbolized that he was always journeying towards the passion, death and resurrection of his Lord and Master, Jesus Christ.

The following is a statement from Bishop Gregory Mansour on the passing of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI:

"After a long life, lived faithfully in the bosom of the Church, Pope Benedict XVI has completed his earthy pilgrimage and now returns to the bosom of the Heavenly Father.

The Pope Emeritus has been preparing for his final judgement by One whom he describes also as friend. The Church and the world are much better because of his life, and we will continue to mine treasures from his teachings and writings. However, the most poignant lessons we will draw are from the way he lived his life in conformity to what he taught and in humble and great respect for both faith and reason.

Pope Benedict was a man of the Church, and he used his intellectual skills to help us understand the Church's faith in a more profound and inspiring way. His first encyclical, God is Love, will be how he is best remembered.

May this humble servant, who called himself a pilgrim, now rest in peace."

The media, unfamiliar with the Catholic Church, as it compares popes usually interprets their teachings to be either different from or contradicting one another. This testifies to the lack of knowledge and to the inexperience among journalists who are not objective. No one can deny that popes have different personalities, but their teachings are in continuity with Church tradition as they respond to the challenges of the modern age.

Pope John Paul II clarified the belief of the Catholic Church. Later, Pope Benedict XVI explained why we believe what we believe. Now, Pope Francis is telling us, "Go do it."

May Pope Benedict XVI rest in light and mercy in the company of the righteous and just.



The First Sunday after the Epiphany

Second Letter to the Corinthians 10:1-11.

I myself, Paul, appeal to you by the meekness and gentleness of Christ I who am humble when face to face with you, but bold towards you when I am away! I ask that when I am present I need not show boldness by daring to oppose those who think we are acting according to human standards. Indeed, we live as human beings, but we do not wage war according to human standards; for the weapons of our warfare are not merely human, but they have divine power to destroy strongholds. We destroy arguments and every proud obstacle raised up against the knowledge of God, and we take every thought captive to obey Christ. We are ready to punish every disobedience when your obedience is complete. Look at what is before your eyes. If you are confident that you belong to Christ, remind yourself of this, that just as you belong to Christ, so also do we. Now, even if I boast a little too much of our authority, which the Lord gave for building you up and not for tearing you down, I will not be ashamed of it. I do not want to seem as though I am trying to frighten you with my letters. For they say, 'His letters are weighty and strong, but his bodily presence is weak, and his speech contemptible.' Let such people understand that what we say by letter when absent, we will also do when present.

The Gospel according to Saint John 1:29-34.

The next day he saw Jesus coming towards him and declared, 'Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, "After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me." I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel.' And John testified, 'I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, "He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit." And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God.'


