

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

For the past couple of weeks the story of the two disciples going to Emmaus three days after the resurrection of Jesus, our Lord and Savior, made me once again ponder the importance of the Eucharist.

Back then at the time of Jesus, but also today, people wonder about Jesus rising from the dead. Could the disciples who loved Jesus so much just have imagined that their Master was raised? How do we know that the disciples did not make the story up so they could attract more followers? Where is it recorded in the Old Testament that the Messiah would be raised in three days? Could the authors of the New Testament have created the story of the resurrection of Jesus? All these are legitimate questions for us to ask and are not different from the confusion and doubt that Cleopas and his friend had on the way to Emmaus. This wonderful gospel in Luke 24 is very relevant today.

The two disciples left the Upper Room in Jerusalem and the company of the followers of Jesus even after they heard that the women who went to the tomb did not find Jesus' dead body there. What is even more surprising is that the women reported that an angel appeared to them while at the tomb to tell them, "Jesus is alive." Nonetheless, the two disciples proceeded with their plan to depart. At the time, the testimony of women did not have any standing and was not admissible in court and yet the announcement of his resurrection was to women. At this stage and in their defense, the two disciples could not to be blamed for not believing in the resurrection.

Luke 24: 24 brings more evidence that Cleopas and his companion should have stayed with the others and have given a little more credence to the idea of Jesus being alive. The two told the stranger—Jesus—who was walking with them, "Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but they did not see him." Now, it is clear that those who went to the tomb were men who, after hearing the women, went to the tomb to check it out themselves and found it just as the women had said, and they did not see Jesus. In addition to the testimony of the women, the men came back with a similar report, but this also was not enough proof for the two disciple to believe that Jesus might be alive.

After conversing with them about why they were looking sad during their trip, and reprimanding them for their hearts slow to believe, Jesus, who was not recognized by the two disciples, started explaining the scriptures to them. For at least two hours, Jesus taught them that it was necessary that the Messiah suffer before he enter into his glory and he interpreted what was told about him in the scriptures. This firsthand explanation from the One who underwent the experience made the hearts of the disciples burn within them, but did not bring them to realize that their master might not be dead.

Only one thing was able to change their confusion and doubt and make them turn and walk seven miles back to Jerusalem. When the two disciples invited Jesus to stay with them, and while he was at the table with them, "he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight" (Luke 24: 30-31). It was the Eucharist that dispelled their disbelief in the resurrection and assured them that Christ was risen.

My friends, neither human eye-witness testimony nor reports equivalent to scientific proofs nor scripture nor commentary on the Old and New Testament were able to convince or increase faith in the resurrection. The ultimate means by which we understand Jesus Christ and his resurrection is the Eucharist, for the Eucharist is Christ himself personally and actively present.

Letter to the Hebrews 13: 18-25

Pray for us; we are sure that we have a clear conscience, desiring to act honorably in all things. I urge you all the more to do this, so that I may be restored to you very soon. Now may the God of peace, who brought back from the dead our Lord Jesus, the great shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the eternal covenant, make you complete in everything good so that you may do his will, working among us that which is pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be the glory for ever and ever. Amen. I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, bear with my word of exhortation, for I have written to you briefly. I want you to know that our brother Timothy has been set free; and if he comes in time, he will be with me when I see you. Greet all your leaders and all the saints. Those from Italy send you greetings. Grace be with all of you.

The Gospel according to Saint John 21: 1-14

After these things Jesus showed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias; and he showed himself in this way. Gathered there together were Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, 'I am going fishing.' They said to him, 'We will go with you.' They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, 'Children, you have no fish, have you?' They answered him, 'No.' He said to them, 'Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some.' So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord!' When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on some clothes, for he was naked, and jumped into the lake. But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, only about a hundred yards off. When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, 'Bring some of the fish that you have just caught.' So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred and fifty-three of them; and though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, 'Who are you?' because they knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.
